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ACADEMICS

W.J. Keenan High School offers the Raider Academy which includes four pathway academies and offers Career and Technical Education (CTE) curriculum in each of the pathways. Students have the opportunity to enroll in Dual Enrollment (DE) course offerings through Midlands Technical College. Rigorous Advance Placement courses are offered for Literature and Composition, Language and Composition, and Calculus. These opportunities challenge students academically. Teachers use a variety of instructional strategies, such as active learning, differentiated instruction, cooperative learning, to actively engage students. Consistent professional development is provided for teachers.

ARTS

W.J. Keenan High School provides opportunities for students to participate in the arts. Students have experiences in vocal and instrumental music, dance, theatre, and many disciplines of the visual arts. Each program has various course levels to include all students who want to participate. Specialized instruction is provided such as percussion, piano, technical theatre production, and painting. Our highly trained teachers, practice and performance facilities, provide our students with supportive environment for arts education and production.
