LRHS has authorized IB Diploma, IB Career and Middle Years Program and has received IBMYP authorization.

Lower Richland High School is a Cognia Nationally certified S.T.E.M school until 2025.

Lower Richland High School provide innovative learning experiences to students in the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.

In 2021-2022, Lower Richland High School had 147 Career and Technical Education (CTE) completers. All CTE Completers have national industry certifications such as OSHA and Microburst Employability Skills.

The Electric Hornets Robotics Team 3976 competed in two District competitions advancing to the semifinals.

In 2021-2022, the Cosmetology program had 9 out of 10 students pass the licensure examinations to be certified State board certified.

The National Beta Club inducted 44 new members for the 2022-2023 school year.

The National Honor Society inducted 44 new members for the 202-2023 school year.

HOSA competed in the State and National Competitions with one member being elected as a state officer representing the state of South Carolina.

HOSA members competed and placed at the SC HOSA State Leadership Conference in North Charleston, SC with 26 students receiving awards including fifteen 1st place awards.

Lower Richland High School Fine Arts Department has maintained the Arts in Basic Curriculum (ABC) Grant for the 2021- 2024 academic years.

Lower Richland High School inducted 15 new members in the National Honor Society Members.

Lower Richland High School inducted 40 new members of the Beta Club.

Girls Basketball Team won the 2022 SCHSL Class 3A Regional Champions.

In 2022, Lower Richland High School partnered with Communities in School. The program has enrolled 44 students with several student being moved toward graduation.
