



## Goals for Next Year

# St. Andrews Middle School has established the following goals for the year:

- The percentage of students in grades 6-8 who score Met or Exemplary in all areas of SCPASS 2014 will increase by 5% or more on SCPASS 2015.
- Increase parental participation and partnership programs by 5%.

## Strategies to address deficiencies include:

- Teachers will continue to accelerate learning at each grade level.
- An after-school academic program is available for all students.
- Collaboration continues between the extended day program teacher and the regular day classroom teacher in order to address deficiencies.
- Students will participate in pull-out classes, Saturday Academy, and tutoring sessions to target small groups of students in standards-based instruction.
- Collaboration will continue between grade level teachers in each content area.
- Additional academic assistance will be provided via computer-assisted instruction with Board Works, Read 180, System 44, Edgenuity, and USA Test Prep.
