## 2019 – 2020 SCHOOL GOALS

The **performance goals** for Alcorn Middle School are as follows:

1. To increase annually the percent of students who meet state standards in the five content areas assessed by the SC State Assessment until the percent meets or exceeds the statewide average.
2. To increase collaborative efforts through a professional learning community among faculty and staff.
3. To create, maintain, and enhance a school environment that is student-centered, safe, and promotes healthy behaviors.
4. To ensure that students at Alcorn Middle School will become proficient readers.

### Student Achievement

1. By 2020, students scoring Met or Exemplary in ELA will increase by 5 points measured by SC READY Assessment.
2. By 2020, students scoring Met or Exemplary in Math will increase by 8 points as measured by SC READY Assessment.
3. By 2020, students scoring Met or Exemplary in Science will increase by 6 points as measured by SC PASS Assessment.

### Teacher/Administrator Quality

By 2023, the percentage of returning teachers will increase to 100% by maintaining a professional learning environment that attracts and supports faculty and staff.

### School Climate

By 2019, the number of office referrals and suspensions will decrease by 10%.
