### Student Achievement

- ⇒ By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 60% of students in grades 6-8 will score meets/exceeds on the SC Ready ELA and Math assessments.
- ⇒ By the end of the 2024-2025 schoolyear, 60% of students in 6<sup>th</sup> grade will score meets/exceeds on the Science SC Ready assessment.

### Teacher/Administrator Quality

By 2024-2025, reduce the teacher turnover rate to 10% by maintaining a professional learning environment that attracts and supports faculty and staff.

### School Climate

By the end of 2024-2025, parental engagement and involvement will increase to 60% as measured by the percentage of parents who attend Open Houses, and parent - teacher conferences.
