


Goals for Next Year

The performance goals for Alcorn Middle School are as follows:

- ⇒ To increase annually the percent of students who meet state standards in the five content areas assessed by the SC State Assessment until the percent meets or exceeds the statewide average.
- ⇒ To increase collaborative efforts through a professional learning community among faculty and staff.
- ⇒ To create, maintain, and enhance a school environment that is student-centered, safe, and promotes healthy behaviors.
- ⇒ To ensure that students at Alcorn Middle School will become proficient readers.

Student Achievement

- ⇒ By 2018, students scoring Met or Exemplary in ELA will increase by ten points measured by SC READY Assessment.
- ⇒ By 2018, students scoring Met or Exemplary in Math will increase by ten points as measured by SC READY Assessment.
- ⇒ By 2018, students scoring Met or Exemplary in Science will increase by ten points as measured by SC PASS Assessment.
- ⇒ By 2018, Students scoring Met or Exemplary in Social Studies will increase by ten points as measured by SC PASS Assessment.

Teacher/Administrator Quality

By 2023, the percentage of returning teachers will increase to 100% by maintaining a professional learning environment that attracts and supports faculty and staff.

School Climate

By 2018, parental engagement and involvement will increase to 85% as measured by the percentage of parents who attend Open Houses, parent - teacher conferences, or student programs and performances as reported on the [EOC Report Card Parent Survey Results](#).
