
Richland One will prepare every student to be a successful, contributing citizen in a global society by providing an effective and high quality education.

Our Goals and Results

Each year, every South Carolina public school must identify goals for a renewal or improvement plan. Arden's goals and outcomes for 2012-2013 are:

Goal One: To promote parental involvement:

Challenges

Arden has a 22% population of students for whom English is a second language.

Pre-K and Kindergarten students are not entering school adequately prepared to meet South Carolina State Standards.

- Tardiness and early dismissal of students continue to be of concern.
- Incomplete in-school assignments and homework not being submitted to teachers in a timely manner is a reoccuring problem that impacts student achievement.
- The students in the self-contained and resource classes are tested on grade level, and the results of those tests are included in the school's overall test scores.
- An operational PTO has been non-existent during 2012-2013 school year.

- Grade level newsletters are sent to parents each month.
- Increased parental involvement, i.e. Family Literacy Nights, Parent Conferences, and SIC.
- ♦ Implemented the Homework Heroes Program.
- Implemented the "Early Bird" Program using the Success Maker Lab in reading and math.
- Interventionist for K-2 in reading and math.
- USDA Healthier US School Silver Award Winner for 2012-2013.
- 2012-2013 Palmetto Silver Award Recipient.
- Increased programs to provide leadership opportunities for students i.e.,
 Student Ambassadors, Boys II Men, and Ladies of Distinction.
- Third year of implementing the Fresh Fruits and Vegetables grant.
- Decrease in the percentage of students expelled or suspended from school.
- Third year of implementation of the Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS).
