## School Highlights & Awards

### 2013-2014 In Review:

- A balanced literacy/response to intervention block was established for all grade-levels. This 25-30 block at the end of the school day is designed to provide teachers with additional time to work with students one-on-one and in small differentiated groups on areas of weakness as identified by Dominie testing, MAP, PASS and other assessments.
- A data room was created in which a data card for every student is maintained. All faculty members are able to assess how students are doing on PASS & MAP, as well as see students' growth after each MAP testing administration.
- Teachers analyzed MAP and Dominie data and mapped students' performance from the beginning of the school year to the year's end in effort to determine students' growth and as a means for providing targeted lessons based on students' academic needs. Students were also provided feedback on their performance.
- Continuous implementation of SuccessMaker Lab is being used to improve reading and math achievement scores.

### Awards & Other Points of Pride

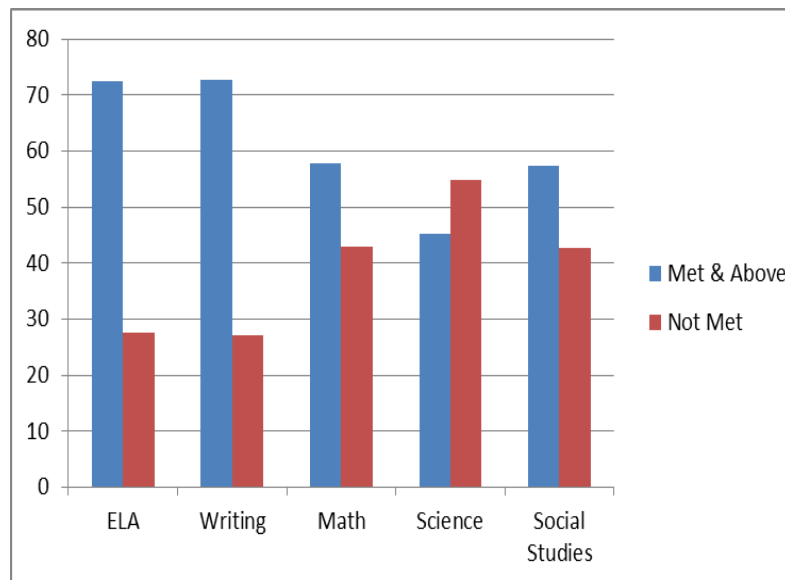
