School Highlights & Awards

2014-2015 In Review:

- A balanced literacy/response to intervention block was established for all grade-levels. This 25-30 block during the school day is designed to provide teachers with addition time to work with students one-on-one and in small differentiated groups on areas of weakness as identified by CPAA, MPG, MAP, PASS and other assessments.
- A data room was created in which a data card for every student is maintained. All faculty members are able to assess how students are doing on PASS & MAP, as well as see students' growth after each MPG/MAP testing administration.
- Teachers analyzed MAP/MPG and CPAA and mapped students' performance from the beginning of the school year to the years' end in effort to determine students' growth and as a means for providing targeted lesson based on students' academic needs. Students were also provided feedback on their performance.
- Continuous implementation of SuccessMaker Lab is being used to improve reading and math achievement scores.


