# Goals for Next Year

**GOAL 1: Increase Student Achievement** 

The school used MyIGDIS, KRA, STAR, District Benchmark Assessments, and Common Formative Assessments to monitor and guide instruction. We continue to use STAR Early Literacy, STAR Reading and Math universal screeners in all grade levels. These assessments provides us with student data three times a year (Fall, Winter, and Spring). In addition we utilize our reading interventionist to provide additional support for students scoring in the 25<sup>th</sup> percentile or below on STAR Early Literacy and STAR Reading.

To increase student achievement in all subject areas, Brennen will continue to implement programs designed to increase student achievement and progress in English Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

Daily classroom instruction is infused with current technology such as SMART Boards/Panels, laptops, iPAD Charging Carts, and iPADS. We continue to provide one-to-one laptops for all students in grades PK4-5<sup>th</sup>. Our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) continues to maintain our awarding winning outdoor classrooms for hands-on lessons in science.

## **GOAL 2: Increase Parent Involvement**

PTO, SIC and the volunteer network provides a wide variety of events and opportunities to allow anyone to become an active member, as well as being informed regarding school events.

Typical events include the Back-to-School Bash. Harvest Happenings, Very Important Person Day, Bingo Night, Sweetheart Dance. Mother/Son Night, General Membership meetings, dinner for Deaf ED Table Talk, staff appreciation throughout the school year, and the Brennen Auction that regularly draws hundreds of attendees.

Getting accurate, timely information to families is critical, which may consist of the following communication channels include weekly classroom newsletters. weekly school messenger call, weekly email blasts, and new online student registration process. Our PTO also utilizes various social media platforms such as FACEBOOK and TWITTER to push information out to parents and our communities.

#### **GOAL 3: Increase Teacher Quality**

Educators continued to increase their professional development that promotes team curriculum writing to integrate standards across subjects, effective instructional strategies, culturally responsive teaching, and establishing and maintaining relationships with families and the community.

Teachers attend professional development workshops, enhancing their ability to integrate the SC college and Career Ready standards and stay ahead of changes in education. Teachers also receive recertification credits through the district.

Teachers continue to work collaboratively in Professional Learning Communities to integrate John Hattie's Visible Learning Research to increase student achievement. In addition they also serve as professional development presenters to faculty and staff.
