In its second year, **Paw Pals** connected volunteer reading tutors with students for small group instruction and extra support.


Arts & Activities



Special Programs

Deaf and Hard of Hearing

Brennen's Deaf and Hard of Hearing program serves students from Richland One and neighboring districts in a positive, inclusive learning environment. Families, students, and staff are invited to twice-monthly dinners to build community and practice sign language.

Multi-Language Learners

About 10% of Brennen students are learning English as an additional language. Our school offers a strong system of supports to help multi-language learners develop English proficiency while learning alongside their peers.

Unified Champions

As a Special Olympics Unified Champion School, Brennen promotes a culture of inclusion for all students. Activities include a school-wide read aloud, peer buddies program, and student participation in the Special Olympics Unified Games.
