## Goals for Next Year

- 90% of students in grades 6-8 will score “approaches” or above on SC READY ELA and 90% of students in grades 6-8 will score “approaches” or above on SC READY Math
  - Use data and grade-level indicators to drive instruction
  - Department and grade-level teams use common planning to tap the strengths of each team member and promote collaboration to improve teaching strategies
  - Common assessments are created by teams for uniform measurement
- 100% of teachers will be trained in Social Emotional Learning
  - School-wide professional development will allow for sharing and growth among teachers
