Check Out Our Data

All students in grades 3-5 take the state PASS Test. The chart below shows the school scores over the past 5 years in each subject area. The students in grades 2-5 take the MAP test three times a year in the fall, winter and spring. MAP is a Nationally Normed test that measures student growth.

PASS (Palmetto Assessment of State Standards) replaced PACT in spring 2009. PASS is aligned to state standards and includes writing, English language arts (reading and research), mathematics, science, and social studies. Percent results below exclude students who tested with non-standard accommodations.
