## ALL STUDENTS RETURN FOR FACE-TO-FACE SCHOOL 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

- All students returned for face-to-face instruction for the 2021-2022 school year
- Fall 2021 MAP scores indicated learning gaps for all students K – Grade 5
- School continued to contract trace and quarantine for students and staff with and exposed to COVID-19 through January 2022 in an effort to stop the spread of COVID-19
- Grades 4 and 5 moved lunch to the classrooms
- Social distancing within classrooms continued through January 2022
- Large number of student and staff absences due to COVID-19 illness and close contact were experienced through January 2022
- School returned to normal operations by March 1 2022
- Contact tracing of COVID-19 was suspended
- ESSER funds provided two part-time tutors serving Grades 3 – 5 students with learning gaps in reading and math
- Students in Grades K – 2 experience gaps in reading continued to receive Leveled Learning Interventions in this content area

## Progress toward Academic Achievement and Growth and Continuing Challenges with COVID-19 Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic created many changes for the 2020-2021 school year. Parents had the option of sending their children to Concord for face-to-face instruction or enrolling their children into the Anderson School District Five Virtual Academy. Additionally, some parents opted to homeschool their children. When the school year began three Concord teachers were sent to teach virtually based on the number of students enrolled in the Virtual Academy and enrolled face-to-face at Concord. After the first semester parents had the option for their children to return to face-to-face instruction or enroll in Virtual Academy. Two teachers returned from Virtual Academy to teach face-to-face instruction. The chart below shows how student enrollment changed throughout the 2020-2021 school year. The table in the column to the right shows state assessment results for both of these groups.

Both virtual and face-to-face students were administered SCReady and SCPASS in the spring of 2021. Parents could opt out of state assessments, and very small number chose to do this. All schools maintained their overall rating from 2019 and did not receive ratings in other areas. The table below shows the percentage of Concord students in Grades 3-5 scoring Exceeds and Meets on the state assessments in English Language Arts and Math. The table also shows the percentage of students scoring Exceeds & Meets in Grade 4 Science. Concord students scored well above Anderson School District Five's overall scores for all district students in these same areas.
