SIC Goals

The 2018-2019 SIC at HMS continues to focus on school climate and teacher morale. In order to collect consistent data to assess progress in improving school climate, the SIC developed an annual survey that was implemented for the first time in October 2018. The principal and SIC will continue to focus its efforts on school climate. In the School Renewal Plan, there are 2 goals related to school climate:

- Teacher Retention: By 2024, HMS will reduce the percent of teacher turnover to 14%
- Satisfaction with the Learning Environment: By 2024, 92% of the 8th grade parents will report they are satisfied with HMS's learning environment.
