Hopkins Elementary has a shared language of learning. This, coupled with students understanding what they are learning and how they know when they have learned it, will positively impact student achievement and empower them to achieve their highest potential and dreams.

HOPKINS ELEMENTARY ADVOCACY PROGRAM

As a part of Richland School District One's strategic plan, all schools are responsible for developing a school-wide advocacy program that includes 100% of each school's total population. Hopkins Elementary is in its second year of implementation. Each child is assigned a HOUSE based on the child's needs. The HOUSES are the House of Amistad (Friendship), the House of Altruismo (Givers), the House of Isibindi (Courage), and the House of Reveur (Dreamers). In each HOUSE, the students have an advocate they meet with twice a month in their advocacy groups. Students requiring additional support are also assigned to the school's social-emotional groups, Brother's Keepers and Sister's Circle. Tier 3 supports are provided through daily check-in and out with assigned advocates.
