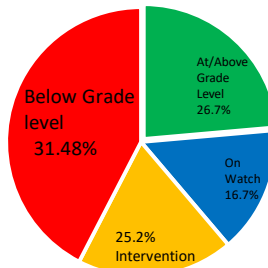

## Test Information

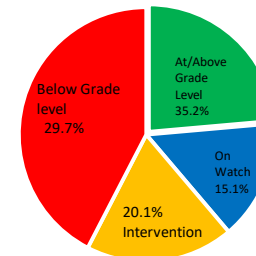
### Star Reading Grades 1<sup>st</sup> -5<sup>th</sup>

The Star Reading test results for the 2021-2022 school year reveals that a little more than 40% of the students at Hyatt Park are performing on or at/above grade level. Results also show 25% of students are in need of intervention. Many of these students are served in small groups and are provided extra support to assist with their progress. Students who are performing below grade level are more than 30%. These students are provided intensive tier 3 instructional support in the area of Reading based on this data.



### Star Math Grades 1<sup>st</sup> -5<sup>th</sup>

The Star Math test results for the 2021-2022 school year reveal that more than 50% of the students at Hyatt Park are performing on or at/above grade level. Testing data also shows that 20% of students are in need of intervention. Students who are in need of math intervention receive tier 2 instruction and are served by the interventionist. Students who are performing below grade level in math at the school are a little over 29%. These students are provided tier 3 instructional support in the area of Math based on this data.
