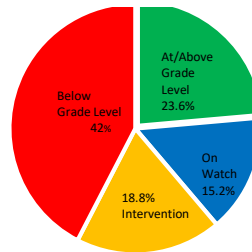

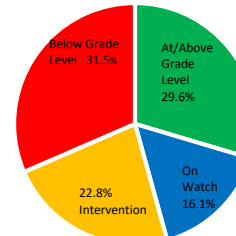
Star Reading Grades 1st -5th

The Reading Inventory test results for the 2020-2021 school year reveals that more than 40% of the students at Hyatt Park performing below grade level in math. As a result of more than half of the students needing additional support in the area of Reading based on this data, we continue our efforts with assisting teachers to increase student achievement. At current, a little over 18% of student are in need of intervention and 23 % of the students are performing at or above grade level.



Star Math Grades 1st -5th

According to the Star Math 2020-2021 school year, more than 30% of the students at Hyatt Park are performing below grade level while 29.6% of the students are performing at or above grade level. 22.8 percent of the students at Hyatt Park are in need of intervention. As a result of nearly half of the students needing additional support in reading based on this data, we continue our efforts with assisting teachers with strategies to increase student achievement.
