## School Highlights

Meadowfield has a large student body with an attendance zone encompassing several diverse communities. Meadowfield fosters independence, creativity and problem-solving skills. It is the only school certified as a National Paideia Model School in South Carolina.

### Paideia makes us unique through:

**Student-led Conferences** Students meet with their parents to review their personal achievements & develop goals for the next nine weeks.

**Coached Projects** Students work collaboratively on projects and present their learning at a school event like a play or festival.

**Seminars** Students sit in a circle to have conversations about something they have read, listened to, or watched. They learn how to ask each other questions, constructively debate, and improve their communication skills.

**Paideia:** Meadowfield was awarded the Jack McCall Award for the most “Powerful School-Based Paideia Leadership.”

**Paideia:** Meadowfield was recently re-accredited for the 2025-2026 school year.

## Achievements & Goals

### Our goals are to:

- Increase the academic achievement of all students in literacy.
- Increase the academic achievement of all students in math.
- Enhance the culture and climate among all stakeholders.
- Improve clarity and communication of opportunities for school involvement and advance parent and public understanding and support of our National Paideia Model School.

### Strategies to achieve these goals are:

#### Professional Development School

This partnership promotes a collaborative school environment with pre-service teachers, Meadowfield staff, and University of South Carolina professors. USC courses are taught on Meadowfield’s campus where interns practice research-based strategies in our classrooms.

#### Professional Development focused on Literacy and Numeracy

Our school professional development plan outlines the scope of work for the year for literacy and numeracy. In addition to our Paideia Instructional Approach, our weekly classroom walkthroughs, analysis of data during Professional Learning Communities (PLC), after-school Professional Learning Opportunities (PLO), Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS), and grade level lesson planning support our efforts in meeting our yearly goals. Each component addresses effective literacy and numeracy instructional practices.

#### Community Support and Partnerships

The Rhodes Agency, Greenlawn Baptist Church, Shandon Baptist Church, and other community-based sponsors provide significant voluntary and financial support. The Parent Teacher Organization sponsors school and neighborhood activities. The United Way’s Midlands Reading Consortium volunteers, mentors and read to students.

#### Student Leadership

All students are encouraged to improve their school experience through representation on Safety Patrol and as Mustang Morning News anchors. Students practice democratic ideals learned within the Paideia model by leading service-learning experiences. Current projects include: a food drive for Harvest Hope Food Bank and March of Dimes Walk. Students also participated and earned recognition at our district and regional science and state art fairs.
