Test Information >

The SC Ready Reading Writing, and Mathematics Test was last administered in Spring 2021 to students in grades 3-5. Students in grades 4 also took the SC PASS Test for Science. Students in Pre-Kindergarten through fifth grade are also assessed throughout the year to determine mastery of curriculum standards and to guide instruction.

The SC Ready and SC PASS test was optional for the 2020-2021 school year and all students weren't required to take the test due to the pandemic.

The data below only represents the students taking the test and not all students.

Goal Strategies >

-Create strategies for the faculty, staff, and students to effectively use the Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) for a safe environment during the COVID-19 pandemic.

-Analyze school STAR Test data and set school-wide goals.

-Implement virtual parent engagement activities to include Open House, SIC, PTO, PAC, Awards Day, Math Night, Parent/Teacher Conference, Literacy/Math Strategy Night (upcoming), Music and Strings Performances, Promotion Ceremonies, and others.

Highlights >>>

-Provided incentives to grades K-5 for meeting the school-wide goal on the star test, Dreambox, and MyLexia.

-Participated in the district Backpack Food Program for all students who qualified.

-Purchased a new marquee.

-Removing old chalk boards and adding new whiteboards and bulletin boards.

-Added individual teacher signs to easily locate their classrooms.

-Increased STAR Reading by 75%, thereby ranking Mill Creek number 2 in the district for growth on assessments.

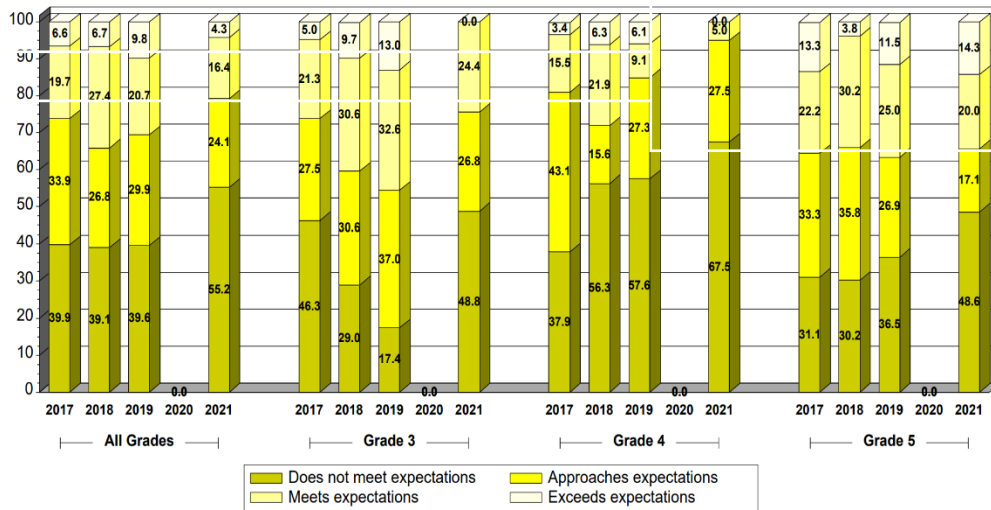
2021 SC READY Five-Year Summary Graphs
