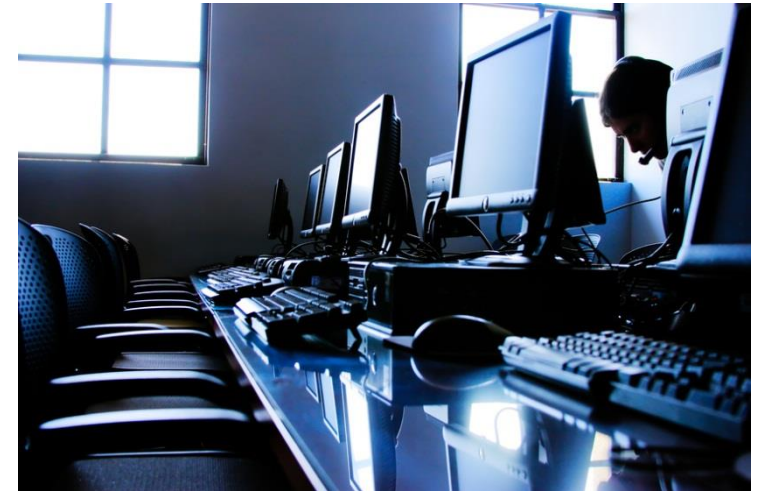

Mrs. Adair's homeroom won Honorable Mention in the category of Photography.

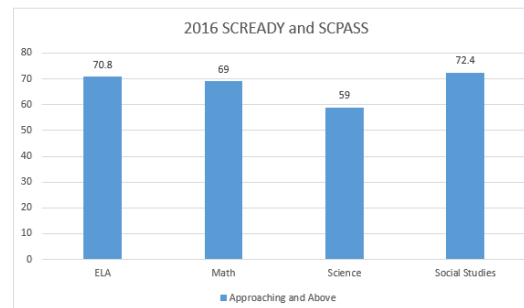
