* The percent of students reading at or above grade level as measured by district assessment will increase 5% annually until it reaches 100%.


Many activities were provided for students and parents such as:

- SuccessMaker (computer-based program) is provided for students in grades 3-5. They attend two times per week.

Additional Information

Edward E. Taylor Elementary has a population of 289 students, in Pre-K thru 5th grade. We have 50 staff members including seven National Board Certified teachers. The levels of our staff's experience varies from 3 to 39 years and includes 2 teachers with doctorial degrees, 4 educational specialists, 9 employees with Master's + 30's, 6 with Masters, 26 with Bachelors.

We have extended the school day from 2:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. to successfully educate our learners and increase the percentage of students scoring basic or above through our comprehensive remediation program. During this time, we offer and intensive tutorial program to students in 3rd grade - 5th grade who scored below the 25th percentile on the TerraNova/InView English Language Arts and Math subtests or the PASS state test in the areas of English Language Arts, math, science, and social studies.. These students receive additional small group and individual academic assistance tutoring Tuesday -Thursday. The curricula and the instructional practices utilized in this intensive intervention program are based upon teacher recommendations, student academic plans, IEP's classroom assessments, district benchmark assessments. Successmaker performance and previous PASS scores. The after-school tutorial is free for qualifying students.
