Our teachers, led by Liz LeBlanc, put on a wonderful Sweetheart Ball, raising money for Relay for Life under the team name Paige's Posse – in honor of one of our employees that defeated cancer.

The Satchel Ford PTO completed multiple highly successful fundraising initiatives and provided support for our school's Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System, the acquisition of additional reading materials for classroom libraries, subscriptions to Study Island and Reading Eggs online software program, as well as many other educational/social initiatives.

Academic Information

According to the 2017 SC Annual School Report Card, the percentage of students who scored "met" or "exemplary" in PASS testing was: 62.2% in science (test was re-normed) and 86.9% in social studies. Pass rates for SC READY ELA and SC READY Math were: 59.4% in ELA and 61.7% inn Math (tests were re-normed).

The faculty continued to focus on literacy instruction using the works of Lucy Calkins, the founding director of Columbia University's Teachers College Reading and Writing Project and expanded our mathematics instructional practices through the implementation of Number Talks, grappling groups, and the use of a math workshop model.

Since 2004 Satchel Ford has been recognized as an Art in Basic Curriculum School and continues to be awarded this designation through grant-writing efforts. Satchel Ford has received over \$310,000 over the past twelve years through grants from the SC Arts Commission and the SC Department of Education's Distinguished Arts Program.

As part of the arts curriculum, all grade levels participated in performances that incorporated the fine arts taught at the school including visual arts, theatre, dance, and music.

Satchel Ford maintained the goal of 100% of the teachers being designated as Highly Qualified in the appropriate content and level as defined by the No Child Left Behind Act. We have 10 teachers who are National Board Certified.

Goals and Improvements

Satchel Ford's School Improvement Plan worked on several major initiatives during the 2017-2018 academic year:

- Overseeing the anti-bullying campaign initiatives.
- This year the successful WatchDOGS program was introduced. WatchDOGS (Dads of Great Students) signed up to each take a day at the school. Starting at drop-off, the dads would interact with students, participate in the classrooms, assist in the lunchroom, and be present on the playground. This was a huge success and we are grateful to our many dads who participated.
- The SIC was also able to continue our relationship with several Life Scout and Eagle Scout candidates from the Boy Scouts of America, leading to the completion of another "Buddy Bench". This bench was installed to encourage the inclusion of shy or uncomfortable students in group play.
- The SIC also coordinated two Duty-Free Lunch days for our teachers to give them a quiet break in the middle of their day. Many thanks to our parents who stepped in to volunteer hours of student supervision so our teachers could have a break!
