The SIC would like to thank the teachers, students, administration, parents, and the PTO for their contributions, ensuring that Satchel Ford Elementary School remains a leading school in our community, district, and state.

Academic Accomplishments

On the <u>2024 SC Annual School Report Card</u>, Satchel Ford Elementary again earned the highest overall rating of "Excellent!" indicating that, "School performance substantially exceeds the criteria to ensure all students meet the <u>Profile of the SC Graduate</u>." The percentage of students who scored "Met" or "Exemplary" on the SC READY ELA were 78.5%, SC READY Math were 74%, and the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment was 68.3%.



This year, educators from grades K-3, Special Education, the reading coach, and administration engaged in LETRS (Language Essentials for Teaching of Reading and Spelling)Volume 1 training. This professional learning opportunity equips teachers with expertise in literacy and the science of reading.

Under the guidance of Heidi Mills from USC, faculty participated in a book study of Learning for Real, discussing the value of inquiry-based instruction. Teachers shared ideas and classroom examples, integrating inquiry into their teaching practices.

Students across various grades explored inquiry projects. First graders studied the Moon, journaling daily observations. Fourth graders researched animal classifications, designing books to present their findings. Fifth graders examined U.S. National Parks, virtually visiting a ranger and creating brochures. Third graders conducted a mini-inquiry on different countries, designing brochures to showcase their learning.

As part of the book study, selected teachers visited the Center for Inquiry (CFI) in Richland School District Two. They observed classrooms and engaged in discussions with CFI educators, enriching their instructional approach through firsthand experiences.

Satchel Ford Elementary Named Special Olympics National Banner Unified Champion School!

This prestigious honor is awarded to schools that go above and beyond in creating an inclusive environment through programs that bring students with and without disabilities together. Schools selected for banner recognition must meet 10 national standards of excellence, which include activities like Special Olympics Unified Sports (where students with and without disabilities compete together) Inclusive Youth Leadership, and Whole-School Engagement initiatives. Chris Payne, Satchel Ford's physical education teacher and advisor of the school's Unified Champion program, shared, "This award is a testament to our wonderful community at Satchel Ford. The students, staff, parents, and community are the driving force behind it all. I am privileged to be a small part of it."

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The PTO has had another incredible year supporting the students, faculty, and staff at Satchel Ford Elementary. With 206 active memberships made up of families, faculty, and staff, we've worked together to make a meaningful difference on campus contributing over 1000 volunteer hours. Thanks to the success of three major fundraisers, we've been able to provide monthly meals for faculty and staff, support field trips for our students, purchase new courtyard tables and outdoor musical instruments to create a sound garden on the playground, sponsor a school-wide author study and fund over \$20,000 in teacher -submitted grants. We're proud of all we've accomplished together this year and grateful for the incredible support from our PTO community.

The Farm at Satchel Ford is a valuable educational resource that offers students of all grade levels meaningful, hands-on learning experiences. SFES parent Chris Wormley leads and organizes outdoor lessons focused on plant and flower life cycles, food safety and tasting, as well as planting and harvesting. Mrs. Cyr collaborates with students and teachers to align garden and chicken coop activities with grade-level standards. Students also take part in caring for the chickens, gaining real-world experience in animal care and responsibility. The outdoor classroom features 12 troughs, 7 large raised beds, and a dedicated pollinator bed.
