The SIC would like to thank the teachers, students, administration, parents, and the PTO for their contributions, ensuring that Satchel Ford Elementary School remains a leading school in our community, district, and state.

Academic Accomplishments

On the 2025 SC Annual School Report Card, Satchel Ford Elementary again earned the highest overall rating of "Excellent!" indicating that, "School performance substantially exceeds the criteria to ensure all students meet the Profile of the SC Graduate." The percentage of students who scored "Met" or "Exemplary" on the SC READY ELA was 82.1%, SC READY Math was 75.3%, SC READY Science was 87.6%. Additionally, thirty-seven students achieved a perfect score on one or more of the 2025 South Carolina Ready tests.

Under the guidance of Heidi Mills, Language & Literacy Professor at the University of South Carolina, and with the assistance of reading coach Brooke Fonder, teachers and students developed inquiry projects. First graders made daily journal observations of the moon. Third graders researched a country and then created brochures with the information they learned about the country. Fourth graders used the science standards to guide their research of an animal and then created a book about the animal. Fifth graders studied all of our National Parks and then created informational articles about what they learned. Fifth graders also learned about magazine production. They applied for the different jobs of producing a magazine and then produced their own magazines.

Satchel Ford Teachers completed the State Department required LETRs training. LETRs is an empowering professional course of study for instructors of reading, spelling, and related language skills.
