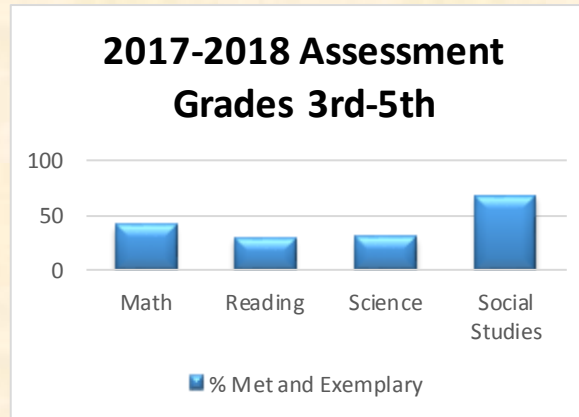
SIC Annual Goals
