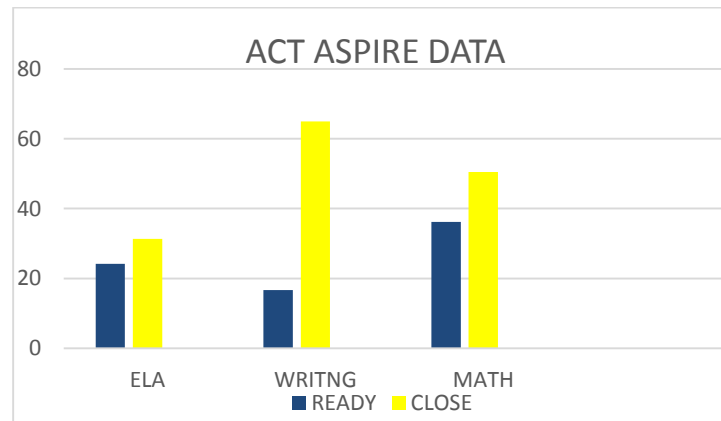
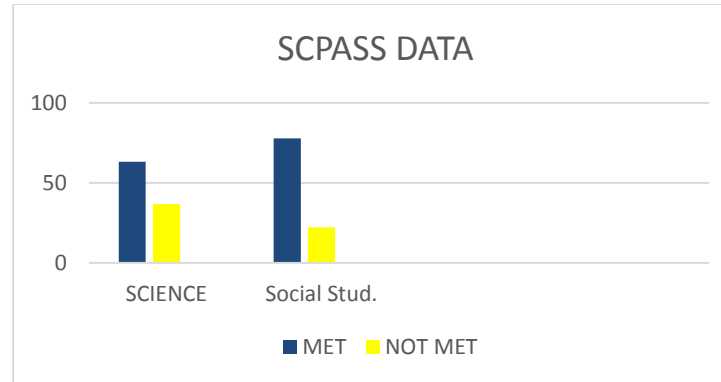

Goals for Next Year

- Students passing the Writing SC Ready assessment will increase by 5% from the baseline passing in 2016.
