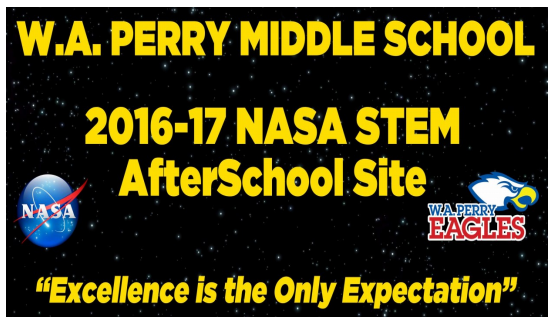
PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

Academic Goals for 2017-2018

By 2018, there will be an increase of 3 percentage points of all students scoring Exceeds Expectations or Meets Expectations in Science and Social Studies as measured by the SCPASS Exam.

By 2018, students scoring Exceeds Expectations or Meets Expectations on the Writing and Reading SC READY assessment will increase by 5% from the baseline percent passing in 2017.

By 2018, students scoring Exceeds Expectations or Meets Expectations on the Math SC READY assessment will increase by 5% from the baseline percent passing in 2017.

By 2018, students "passing" in English I, Algebra I, US History, and Biology will increase by 5 points as measured by EOCEP.
