GOALS FOR 2016-2017

- ✚ At the end of the 2016-2017 academic year, there will be an increase of 3 percentage points of all students at W. A. Perry Middle School scoring Met or Exemplary in Science and Met or above in Social Studies as measured by the SCPASS Exam.
- ✚ By 2017, students "passing" the Writing and Reading SC READY assessment will increase by 5% from the baseline percent passing in 2016.
- ✚ By 2017, students "passing" the Math SC READY assessment will increase by 5% from the baseline percent passing in 2016.
- ✚ By 2017, students "passing" in English I, Algebra I, US History, and Biology will increase by 5 points as measured by EOCEP.
