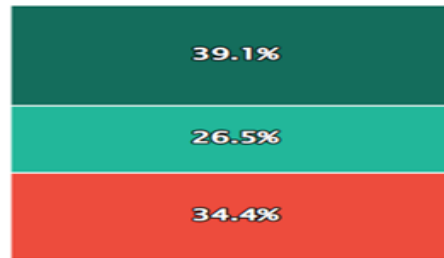
Action-Based Learning Labs and

Star Math Current Student Growth Percentile (SGP) Fall to Spring 2021-2022

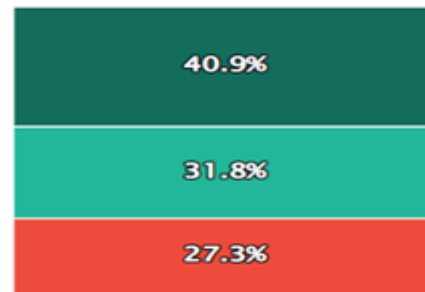
