- Sophomore S.T.A.R.S. program provides pathways to Advanced Placement and Dual Enrolment opportunities, career exploration and soft skills training, standardized test preparation & practice, and peer mentoring
- Increase digital integration of traditional instructional strategies and assessment methods that support rigor and relevance
- Promote and provide AVID strategy training for all faculty members
- Provide time for teachers to collaboratively plan, analyze data, and create assessments.
