Student Achievement

Due to the 2019 COVID Pandemic, the U.S. Department of Education granted a waiver to bypass standardized testing for the 2019-2020 school year, providing relief from federally mandated testing requirements. The assessment results below reflect students' performance on the MyIGDIS, Kindergarten (KRA) and STAR Reading and Math assessment administered in Fall 2020.

MyIGDIS – Children begin to develop early literacy, early numeracy, and social-emotional skills needed for kindergarten while they're still in preschool. MyIGDIs helps us to quickly and accurately assess this development so we can intervene early and provide all learners with targeted support for success.

Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) - The KRA determines each child's readiness level from an evaluation of four domains: Social Foundations, Language/Literacy, Mathematics, and Physical Well-Being. The KRA provides a snapshot of students' abilities at the beginning of the kindergarten school year.

STAR Reading – Comprehensive reading assessment that provide the insight needed to guide literacy growth for emergent readers, struggling readers, and high achievers, whether you are testing inperson, remotely, or a combination of both.


STAR Math – Provides insight into each student's math skills and subskills—whether they're learning in-person, remotely, or a blend of both. STAR Math allows universal screening, progress monitoring, and goal setting.
