## **FHES Student Achievement**

During the 2018-2019 school year, the school commenced with the continuation of the new administrative team. Previous data indicated the need for addressing overall climate at Forest Heights. This has resulted in positive change within the culture and climate of our school. The priority for the present school year was on student academic teaching and learning. There is a renewed focus on Student Growth where students take responsibility for their own learning.

Forest Heights Elementary is equipped for 21<sup>st</sup> century learning with wireless internet capability throughout the school. All students in grades K-5<sup>th</sup> have one on one access to digital learning devices. The devices are utilized in a variety of ways from Reading A to Z and 1<sup>st</sup> in Math to Mastery Connect. Every classroom in the school has a Smartboard and several classrooms have document cameras.

Forest Heights has 21% of students who are in the advanced or proficient reader category according to Reading Inventory assessment. Our Math Inventory data shows 14% of our students are performing at an advanced or proficient level. The KRA assessment during the fall of 2018 showed that 19.3% of the kindergarten students demonstrated readiness for kindergarten.

School Climate, overall is showing improvement. Parent involvement and engagement has declined during this school year. However, the remaining PTO and SIC members are continually seeking ways to work hand in hand with our teachers and school community for the betterment of Forest Heights Students.

### **Additional Information**

The student body has 407 African American students (199 males and 208 females), 58 Hispanic/Latino (25 males and 33 females), two or more races 21 (11 males and 10 females), and 14 Caucasian students (7 males and 7 females). There are 56 students in special education services (37 males and 19 females). This number includes speech, resource, and self-contained. There are 47 ESOL students (19 males and 28 females) in grades Pre-K – 5th).

Forest Heights has 31 certified teachers on staff. The highly qualified staff consists of 2 National Board Certified Teachers and 56.25% have advanced degrees. The average teacher salary is \$43,986.00. The teacher-student ratio is 1:17.87 overall. The teacher-student ratios by grade are as follows 1:11.5 Pre-K, 1:20.75 K, 1:19.75 1st, 1:19.75 2nd, 1:21.75 3rd, 1:19.4 4th, and 1:20.75 5th.

These volunteers and mentors serve FHES during the school day, during after-school programs, and some even participate in weekend events. All students are instructed through the use of South Carolina College and Career-Ready Standards for ELA and Math, the South Carolina Academic Standards and Performance Indicators for Science and Social Studies and South Carolina Academic Standards for Health and Safety Education for health.
