Goal #1:

Reduce the percentage of third graders scoring Does Not Meet in the spring of 2021 as determined by SC READY from 46% to 21 % in the spring of 2022.

Action Steps:

- 1. Provide authentic reading and writing experiences through planning based on the SCCCR Standards
- 2. Provide daily guided reading instruction for all students. All teachers will provide daily guided reading to all students.
- 3. Meet with the Literacy Coach once a week to ensure ELA instruction meets the rigor of the SCCCR Standards

Goal #2:

During the 2021-2022 school year, all teachers will conduct bi-weekly reading and writing conferences to monitor student engagement and increase reading and writing volume.

Progress:

Teachers were provided with the opportunity to take a Guided Reading class during the 2021-2022 school year. During the class, teachers learned what a reading conference was and the value in having them. Teachers created reading notebooks for the students and included reading logs. Teachers have the goals for students displayed and discuss the progress on the goals during conferences. Teachers have students create new reading goals when necessary.
