Highlights & Awards

Spring Valley High is a 450,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art facility serving a diverse student body. We have cutting-edge technology, content-specific science and fine arts labs, and exceptional athletic facilities. In addition to our comprehensive CATE programs, Spring Valley houses two magnet math and science programs.

Our science and math magnet program students earned over 111 awards in competitions and represented the school at two international competitions. One Discovery student was chosen as Scholars in the 2019 Regeneron Science Talent Search.

Our Fine Arts program produced National Scholastic Art Award winners for the 8th consecutive year. Additionally, 24 student pieces were selected as Southeast Regional Level Scholastic award winners in 2019.

The Class of 2018 had 4 National Merit Finalists, 36 High School League Scholar Athletes, 49 Palmetto Fellows, 42 SC Academic Honor Graduates, 119 Hope Scholarships, 111 Life Scholarships, and earned \$32,462,457.00 in scholarship offers.

So far this school year, we have had 10 Region V AAAAA Championship athletic teams and 1 Upper State Championship team.
