Magnet Programs

Spring Valley offers two distinct Magnet options: Discovery and Explorations. Each program offers a unique opportunity for students to excel.

<u>Discovery</u>: A four-year science and math-based Honors/AP program incorporating two years of independent research for students committed to academic excellence.

<u>Explorations</u>: A four-year science and math-based college preparatory program with an emphasis on forensic science, culminating with a 200-hour internship.

Spring Valley High School (Discovery and Explorations magnet programs) was named a National Magnet School of Excellence by Magnet Schools of America in 2018, 2019, and 2020 and a Magnet School of Distinction in 2017 and 2022 by Magnet Schools of America.

Spring Valley High School Magnet students earned numerous awards for their original research during the 2021-2022 school year, including 47 awards at USC Region 2 Science and Engineering Fair as well as 25 oral presentation awards and 28 written research paper awards at South Carolina Junior Academy of Science (SCJAS).
