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For the 2023-2024 school year, SVHS had two athletic teams crowned Region Champions: Boys' Tennis and Boys' Track. Juston Skelton (Boys Basketball) and Gisele Atim (Girls Tennis) were named player of the year in their respective sports. The Class of 2023 had 1 US Presidential Scholar, 9 National Merit Finalists, 92 High School League Scholar-Athletes, 48 Palmetto Fellows, 44 SC Academic Honor Graduates, 155 Hope Scholarships, 111 Life Scholarships, and earned \$40,957,257 in scholarship offers.

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
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The Spring Valley Red Cross Club donated \$1,200.00 to the Red Cross Maui/Hawaii fund to support the disastrous fires that devastated the area.

MAGNET PROGRAMS

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Spring Valley offers two distinct Magnet options: Discovery and Explorations. Each program offers a unique opportunity for students to excel.

Discovery: A four-year science and math-based Honors/AP program incorporating two years of independent research for students committed to academic excellence.

Explorations: A four-year science and math-based college preparatory program with an emphasis on forensic science and career exploration, culminating with a 200-hour internship.

Spring Valley High School (Discovery and Explorations magnet programs) was named a National Magnet School of Excellence by Magnet Schools of America in 2018, 2019, 2020, 2023, 2024 and a Magnet School of Distinction in 2017 and 2022 by Magnet Schools of America. In addition, Spring Valley earned Certification as a National Demonstration School in 2019 and was recertified at the same level in 2023. Spring Valley High School Magnet students earned numerous awards for their original research during the 2023-2024 school year, including 62 awards at USC Region 2 Science and Engineering Fair as well as 29 oral presentation awards and 32 written research paper awards at the South Carolina Junior Academy of Science (SCJAS).
