School Highlights & Awards

Spring Valley High is a 450,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art facility serving a diverse student body. We have cutting-edge technology, content-specific science and fine arts labs, and exceptional athletic facilities. In addition to comprehensive and CATE programs, our school houses three schools-within-a-school: magnet math and science programs, a freshman academy, and an Arts in Basic Curriculum Program. Our science and math magnet program students won over 60 awards for science research. Our senior class had 8 National Merit Finalists, 31 High School League Scholar Athletes, 38 Palmetto Fellows, 43 SC Academic Honor Graduates, 64 Hope Scholarships and 121 Life Scholarship recipients. The Senior Class earned \$44,105,962 in scholarships, with 61.9% of seniors receiving scholarships. Sixteen athletic teams won Region Championships. Our Girls Basketball Team were the State Champions and were ranked #2 in the state. Our Boys Track Team were state runners-up. This year Spring Valley began implementing Design Teams and Professional Learning Leaders and continued the Smaller Learning Communities, Viking Way and Drop-Out Prevention Programs.
