Highlights & Awards

Spring Valley High is a 450,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art facility serving a diverse student body. We have cutting-edge technology, content-specific science and fine arts labs, and exceptional athletic facilities. In addition to our comprehensive CATE programs, Spring Valley houses two magnet math and science programs and a freshman academy.

Our science and math magnet program students earned over 83 awards in competitions and represented the school at two international competitions. Our Fine Arts program produced National Scholastic Art Award winners for the 6th consecutive year.

The Class of 2016 had 8 National Merit Finalists, 47 High School League Scholar Athletes, 37 Palmetto Fellows, 33 SC Academic Honor Graduates, 109 Hope Scholarships, 132 Life Scholarships, and earned \$47,225,454 in scholarship offers.

So far this school year, we have had 3 Region V AAAAA Championship athletic teams.
