Highlights & Awards

Spring Valley High is a 450,000 sq. ft. state-of-the-art facility serving a diverse student body. We have cutting-edge technology, content-specific science and fine arts labs, and exceptional athletic facilities. In addition to our comprehensive CATE programs, Spring Valley houses two magnet math and science programs and a freshman academy. Our science and math magnet program students earned over 80 awards and represented the school at three international competitions. Our fine arts program has produced National Scholastic Art Award winners five of the last six years. The Class of 2014 had 6 National Merit Finalists, 1 National Achievement Finalists, 55 High School League Scholar Athletes, 40 Palmetto Fellows, 31 SC Academic Honor Graduates, 72 Hope Scholarships, 143 Life Scholarships, and earned more than \$43,000,000 in scholarship offers. This school year we have had 5 Region IV AAAA Championship athletic teams, and our Girls Basketball team won the AAAA State Championship for the third time in the past six years.
