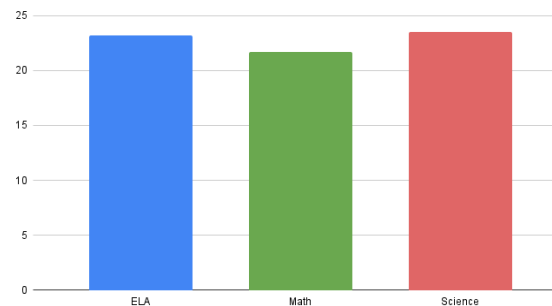


SIC Goals
