Community of Learning Model

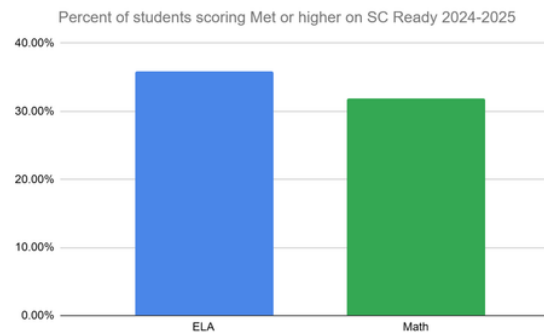
