Summit Parkway has a total enrollment of 886 students in grades 6-8. African American students comprise 63.5% of the student population, while Caucasian students represent 12.1%, Hispanic/Latino students represent 16.0%, Asian students represent 1.7%, 6.3% are classified as Two or More Races and 0.2% as Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander. Of the 886 students, 48% receive free or reduced lunch.
