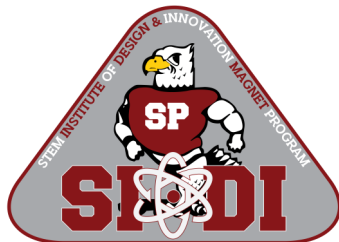

Demographics

We have a total enrollment of 1,065 students in grades 6-8. Our student population consist of 63.9% African Americans, 14.6% Latino or Hispanics, 10.4% Whites, 7.5% Two or More Races, 2.9% Asian and 0.6% who are not reported. The gender percentage is males 51.2% and females 48.8%. There are 65.5% pupils in poverty and 14.9% with military connections. All students receive free breakfast and lunch daily regardless of income status.
