Demographics

We have a total enrollment of 1,016 students in grades 6-8. Our student population consist of 64.3% African Americans, 15.6% Latino or Hispanics, 10.4% Whites, 6.7% Two or More Races, 2.8% Asian and 0.1% who are not reported. Of these students, 50.8% are males and 49.2% are females. There are 65% pupils in poverty and 14.2% with military connections. All students receive free breakfast and lunch daily regardless of income status.
