Mission Statement: Ridge View Arts Innovation for Medical Sciences Magnet School offers a premier learning environment by providing authentic, collaborative, engaging, and meaningful learning experiences and opportunities that prepare students for the 21st century challenges and responsibilities of global citizenship.

With SIC's approval, Ridge View Arts Innovation for Medical Sciences Magnet will become Ridge View High School, A Med Pro Magnet starting in the 2022-2023 school year. We have two specialized magnets, the Scholars Academy Magnet of Business and Law and the Institute of Health Sciences (IHS), and four schools-within-a-school, Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID), Carolina Alliance for Technology (CAT), AVID Early College, and the School for the Arts (SFA). As we returned to face-toface instruction, we remained focused on our vision - **Prepare Today for Success Tomorrow**. As we continued to excel in the 4 As – Academics, Activities, Arts, and Athletics, we also concentrated on the physical and emotional well-being of our staff, students, and community. Our efforts resulted in our three magnet programs – Arts Institute of Medical Sciences, the Institute of Health Sciences, and the Scholars Academy Magnet for Business and Law – being designated as National Magnet Schools of Excellence. We also received the South Carolina Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development Whole Child Award. Although this may have been a challenging year for everyone, it did not stop our students, faculty, and staff from continuing to excel in the 4 As.

Schools-Within-A-School and Magnet Programs



Scholars Academy Magnet for Business and Law: The Ridge View Scholars Academy Magnet for Business and Law is an energetic learning community of highly motivated students committed to achieving the goals of a challenging academic curriculum focused on Law and Business through a fouryear Honors/AP track.

School for the Arts: The School for the Arts is designed for students who have special talents and serious interest in the arts fields - visual arts, band, orchestra, chorus, dance, creative writing, and drama.
