### **Annual Parent Update**

2020 - 2021

**Mission Statement:** Ridge View Arts Innovation for Medical Sciences Magnet School offers a premier learning environment by providing authentic, collaborative, engaging, and meaningful learning experiences and opportunities that prepare students for the 21st century challenges and responsibilities of global citizenship.

Ridge View Arts Innovation for Medical Sciences Magnet has two specialized magnets, the Scholars Academy Magnet of Business and Law and the Institute of Health Sciences (IHS), and four schools-within-a-school, Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID), Carolina Alliance for Technology (CAT), AVID Early College, and the School for the Arts (SFA). Although this school year taught us to be flexible, we remained focused on our vision - **Prepare Today for Success Tomorrow**. Our first cohort of Richland Two AVID Early College students graduated with not only their high school diploma, but also an Associates degree from the University of South Carolina-Sumter. The Scholars Academy and Institute of Health Science programs received the Magnet Schools of America (MSA) School of Distinction Award. The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the learning platform of students, but it did not stop our students, faculty, and staff from continuing to excel in the 4 As -- Academics, Activities, Arts, and Athletics.

- ♦ Toluwanimi Ariyo, an Institute of Health Science Magnet Junior, earned 1st place at the State Junior Symposium of Humanities and Science.
- School for the Arts and Scholars Academy Magnet Senior, Sarah Hasan, was accepted into the Ron Brown Scholar Capstone Program, which encourages civic engagement among Scholars while promoting academic excellence, community and lifelong interactions. Hasan also received a full tuition scholarship to Duke University, where she plans to study Pre-law.






• 31 Ridge View Band members qualified for Region Band.

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## **Schools-Within-A-School and Magnet Programs**

**Achievement Via Individual Determination (AVID):** This program, based on a national program, identifies students who have been performing at average levels, presents them with the tools to move successfully to high level courses, and prepares them for college.

**Arts Innovation for Medical Science Magnet (AiMS):** AiMS is a school-wide STEAMM magnet for all students that provides innovative curriculum connections between academic disciplines to enhance the development of the whole student, both mind, and body, for global citizenship.

*Carolina Alliance for Technology (CAT):* The Carolina Alliance for Technology (CAT) program is a small learning community that promotes project-based learning with career-based field studies, job shadowing, and mentoring through partnerships with IT and Engineering based businesses.


Institute for Bio-Health Sciences and Allied Health Sciences: The Bio-Health Sciences Magnet program at Ridge View High School, in conjunction with the nationally recognized Project Lead the Way Biomedical Sciences™ program, offers highly achieving students a dynamic curriculum that uses real world experience and hands on learning. Students with interest in exploring the variety that health sciences offers will find PLTW's Biomedical Sciences™ program to be a fantastic doorway for medical professions.

**Scholars Academy Magnet for Business and Law:** The Ridge View Scholars Academy Magnet for Business and Law is an energetic learning community of highly motivated students committed to achieving the goals of a challenging academic curriculum focused on Law and Business through a four-year Honors/AP track.

**School for the Arts:** The School for the Arts is designed for students who have special talents and serious interest in the arts fields - visual arts, band, orchestra, chorus, dance, creative writing, and drama.
