Through Unified Buddies, we collaborate with other teachers to plan and facilitate weekly activities for special needs students and their second grade mentors, known as their Unified "buddy". Coming together for a common goal improved and strengthened the school culture and community and impacted the lives of all students by teaching them about inclusion, respect, and friendship. The Unified program teaches students the LIFESKILLS of friendship, cooperation, and leadership as well as other physical and social skills. Over the years, our school has grown the Unified program from 54 students to now over 90 students. Over 215 students have been members of the Unified Buddies program and the number only continues to grow. The program advocates for all students, to spread the message of inclusion and friendship.
