As one of only two National AVID Demonstration Sites in SC, Kelly Mill is dedicated to getting students focused on college readiness and 21st century skills. Building on the district's belief of learning community, character, and joy our students are immersed in a highly engaged environment. Kelly Mill Middle strives to enhance the learning environment for all students by focusing on the district's and school beliefs. We are very proud of our students' accomplishments this year. Kelly Mill had 18 Junior Scholars, as well as award-winning music programs with superior ratings. We also have competitive teams for Math Counts, Step Team, and Quiz Whiz. Our parent and community volunteers play a major role in the success of our school. They have contributed hundreds of hours of their time, and are steadfast in helping make our organization more dynamic and effective. Our curriculum nights for science, literacy, math, and social studies were successful in bringing parents and community into the school. These events were largely organized and sponsored by our parent groups. The staff at Kelly Mill strives to provide our students with innovative, challenging work that helps them collaborate to solve problems.

The AVID Program accelerates student-

learning and encourages inquiry-based teaching methods. We engage in AVID instructional practices school wide to prepare our students for the college and 21st century careers.

We also use technology as an integral component of instruction. We offer oneto-one computing for all students. Each classroom has a Promethean Board, and all students have access to IPADs, TI-Inspire calculators, and chrome books to give them the tools for success. Honors classes are available in all four core content areas: English, Math, Science, and Social Studies, and we have a business and economics magnet school, Kelly Mill INC., which is a competitive program for the academically gifted student. Our Kelly Mill INC Magnet received the award of Magnet School of Excellence during the 2014-15 school year.

It is a goal of Kelly Mill to assist students by encouraging parents and community members to be partners in their education. This practice helps us expand our dialogue about what we can best do to improve student achievement. Through this dialogue we continue to be dedicated to ensuring all students have excellent teachers and staff that shape the Kelly Mill experience for our students. We know if we all focus and believe our students will excel and achieve.

Initiatives and Strategies for School Improvement

Kelly Mill, in partnership with its School Improvement Council has taken on the following tasks and strategies to continue our path to providing the best possible educational outcomes for our students.

- Analyzing data to make sure we are serving all students and prioritizing our efforts.
- Meet with teachers annually to discuss student performance on annual tests and other data.
- Assisting staff with using diagnostic software to analyze data.
- Utilize grade distribution and pass/fail rates to identify student that need assistance and teachers that need support.
- Design professional development to help teachers implement engaging tasks students will be motivated to complete.
- Design our master schedule and bell schedule to help meet the needs of all stakeholders.
- Increase AVID instructional strategies in classrooms across the school.
- Analyze and review the rigor for all students in each curriculum course.

- Analyze the achievement gap at Kelly Mill and discuss strategies to address it.
- Further develop and expand our mentoring programs to reach atrisk students.
- Provide time for general education teachers to collaborate with special education teachers.
- Implement reading strategies across the curriculum in all subject areas.
- Research and develop programs that encourage students to read.
- Increase writing in the content areas to require students to analyze and synthesize information.
- Provide leadership and growth opportunities for all faculty and staff.
- Promote all teachers and staff publicly through news, publications, etc.
- Enhance extracurricular opportunities that support both academic and individual interests of students.
- Continue to design celebrations that celebrate all student successes.
- Promote character development. •

- Consistently reinforce procedures, ٠ guidelines, and expectations with all students.
- Promote a respectful environment and appreciation for diversity by holding a Diversity Day and continuing our PEACE program where general education students work with students with special needs.
- Increase vertical collaboration to help students transition from 5th to 6th and 8th to 9th grades.

Kelly Mill is a Great School!

For many families and members of the community, the first look at Kelly Mill is a rating on the web site GreatSchools.org. Real estate listings provide potential buyers with school information and GreatSchools.org

is one of the most used resources for this service. The problem for Kelly Mill is that GreatSchools.org's rating system paints an unfair depiction of Kelly Mill. Kelly Mill shares a campus with one of our elementary magnet schools, one specifically designed to help students that are performing below grade level. There are a little fewer than 100 students in grades 2-5 in that elementary program. Kelly Mill Middle serves over 900 students in grades 6-8. GreatSchools.org averages each grade level's performance equally. So by their calculation, fewer than 100 students that have been selected for a program for underperforming children are accounting for nearly half of the rating of a population that is over



1000 students. If GreatSchools.org properly weighted their formula, Kelly Mill would have higher GreatSchools.org rating. That being said, there is always room for improvement, and Kelly Mill is dedicated to helping students reach their highest potential. However, a four is a number that negatively portrays a population and institution that is meeting goals, engaging with the community, and garnering some truly wonderful achievements. Kelly Mill INC. is a district school within a school magnet program offering a unique middle school experience, engaging students with broader and deeper depth of content, fast pacing, and an embedded global business and economics strand. Through the incorporation of the business and economics theme, INC. students pursue an education designed to equip them

with the skills necessary for leadership and success in their chosen career field in the face of mounting pressures of competition from around the world. Kelly Mill INC. students were recognized in February for winning the South Carolina Finance Challenge. Teams from the INC program have been back to back champions in the state-wide competition for three years. The first place

winning team was comprised of Alexia Pryor, Jordan Dover, Thomas Kane, and Brooklyn Christensen. They were supported by their coach, Nicole Smith, and the INC lead teacher, Pam Bruney. Kelly Mill, INC. was named a Magnet School of Excellence in 2015 by Magnet Schools of America (MSA), the national association for magnet and theme-based schools.
