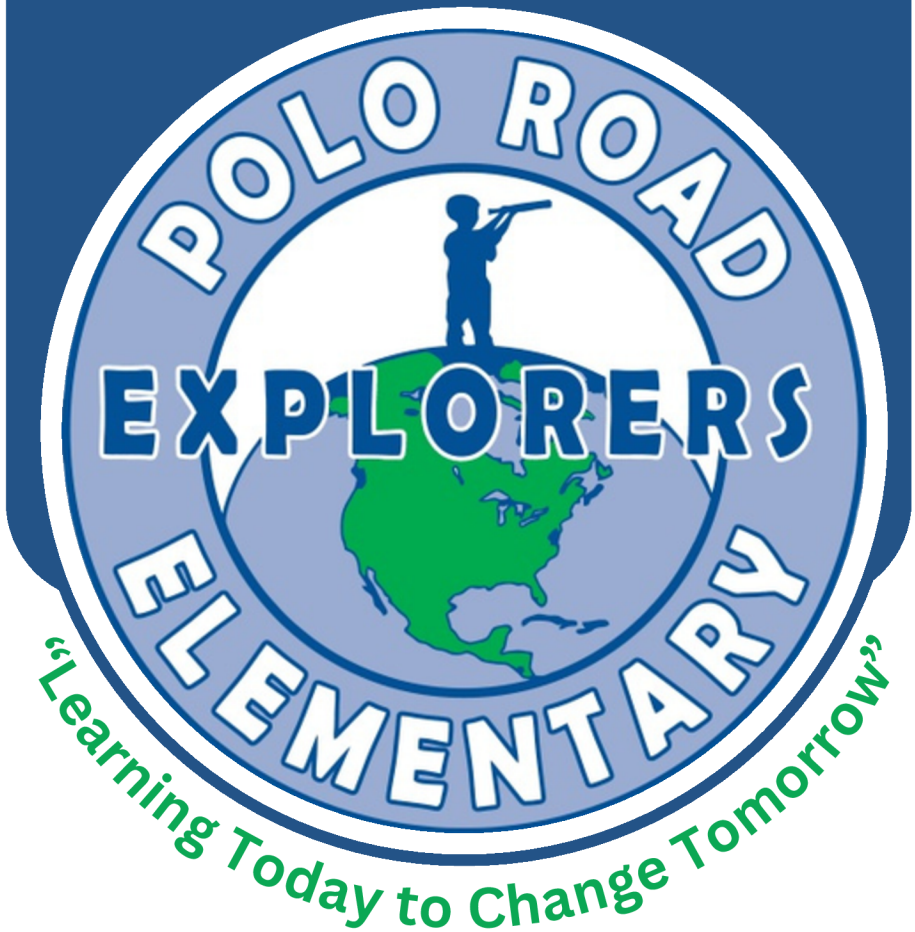

- Implementing research based Science of Reading strategies, with a high percentage of teachers trained in LETRS and Orton Gillingham
- Facilitating Monthly Math Moments grounded in the Concrete Representational Abstract model, with a focus on fluency, productive struggle, word problems, and key standards
- Mathematically enriching the school environment through interactive bulletin boards, math flashcards, manipulatives, and visible math prompts that encourage daily engagement
- Establishing school wide Student Learning Objectives focused on math fluency to guide targeted instruction
- Utilizing Professional Learning Team rotations to foster collaborative planning, data analysis, and instructional alignment across grade levels
